U.S. ENTERPRISE FACILITATORS MEET FOR 2-DAY FORUM IN GREAT BEND, KANSAS

GREAT BEND, KS OCTOBER 1, 2009: Enterprise Facilitators from all over the U.S. met in Great Bend, Kansas on September 17th and 18th to learn new techniques and network with other facilitators from around the country. The Enterprise Facilitators, who assist entrepreneurs in starting or expanding businesses in their home areas, all practice a business management method begun by the Sirolli Institute (www.sirolli.com) known as the Trinity of Management™. This method states that all entrepreneurs should build management teams to assist them in at least one of 3 areas in which they are not particularly strong. The areas of management are the product or service, sales and marketing and financial management.
